Chancellor's Scholarship

- Annual award up to \$8,000 per year.
- Renewable for 4 years (5 years for Architecture students).

Chancellor's Community Scholarship

- Annual award up to \$5,000 per year.
- Renewable for 4 years (5 years for Architecture students).

Silas Hunt Scholarship

- Annual award \$5,000 \$8,000 per year.
- Renewable for 4 years (5 years for Architecture students).
- Awarded to students from underrepresented communities who have demonstrated outstanding academic leadership potential.

Leadership Scholarship

- Annual award up to \$2,000 per year.
- Renewable for 4 years (5 years for Architecture students).



Auburn aims to elevate the student experience by providing opportunities for hands-on learning. Students graduate with real-world knowledge that is valuable in the workplace or when applying to professional or graduate schools.

SCHOLARSHIP CONSIDERATION auburn.edu/scholarship

Auburn is proud to award a number of scholarships to students each year. Students must complete the admissions application and be accepted for admission prior to receiving consideration for scholarships. The scholarship application is available through the Auburn University Scholarship Opportunity Manager (AUSOM) and provides consideration for general and departmental scholarships.

First-year students accepted for admission receive automatic consideration for competitive merit and select need-based scholarships. Consideration is based on several factors including, but not limited to, high school GPA and standardized test score. Competitive merit scholarships are awarded competitively among first-year students who meet the minimum requirements for consideration, and consideration does not quarantee an award. Applicants are responsible for confirming correct test scores and GPA have been received by the deadline.

To receive consideration for needbased scholarships, students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)*. More information on available scholarships, the process for consideration, and pertinent deadlines can be found on our website at aub.ie/firstyearsch.

GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL SCHOLARSHIPS

General and departmental scholarships are awarded to incoming and current students. First-vear students accepted for admission by mid-January should complete the scholarship application in AUSOM by February 15 for general and departmental scholarship consideration. Criteria vary, including, but not limited to, geographic location as defined by city, county, or state of residence and/or high school attended, academic achievement, financial need, and for departmental scholarships, college, and academic major. Generally, first-year students must have a minimum 3.0 high school GPA for consideration. Financial need is determined by the FAFSA, which must also be received by Auburn by February 15. Students selected for financial need verification are not eligible for need-based scholarships if the verification process is incomplete. Scholarships are awarded competitively, and consideration does not quarantee an award. General

and departmental scholarships are awarded in late March. The average award amount for general and departmental scholarship recipients is \$1,500 to \$2,000 for one year.

*The FAFSA is the only form a student is required to complete to be considered for student assistance from any of the Title IV HEA programs, except for information needed to ensure the student's eligibility for such assistance (e.g., information needed to complete verification or to demonstrate compliance with the student eligibility provisions of the HEA and the regulations). Additional information, if requested, will be listed on the student's AU Access My Finances page after results of the FAFSA are received. For additional information, visit auburn.edu/finaid.

Three signature scholarships comprise the majority of Vanderbilt's merit awards:

- The Ingram Scholars Program recognizes students who plan to combine a professional or business career with an entrepreneurial spirit and an exceptional commitment to civic-minded service, innovation and leadership.
- The Chancellor's Scholarship recognizes students with outstanding academic records who have worked to build strong high school communities by bridging gaps among economically, socially and racially diverse groups and have demonstrated significant interest in issues of diversity education, tolerance and social justice.
- The Cornelius Vanderbilt Scholarship recognizes students who combine
 outstanding academic achievement with strong leadership and contributions
 outside the classroom.

Recipients of these scholarships are guaranteed full-tuition awards for up to eight semesters. The awards include a stipend for research, study abroad, a creative endeavor or the required Immersion Vanderbilt experience. Approximately 250 of these merit-based scholarships are awarded each year.

A separate application is required for the Cornelius Vanderbilt Scholarship; you must apply to be considered. For the Ingram Scholars Program and for the Chancellor's Scholarship, the application is strongly encouraged; preference is given to those who apply. These applications are available to students on their MyAppVU portal after they have applied for admission.

- **2.** We meet 100 percent of demonstrated need for all admitted students.

This initiative does not involve income bands or income cutoffs that limit eligibility.

Undocumented and DACA students are eligible for Vanderbilt's need-based financial aid program in the same way as U.S. citizens.
