What You Should Do If Your Student Was **Exposed Outside Of School**

- 1. Call the Nassau County Health Department at (904) 875-6100
- 2. Provide the Following Information:
- Possible Exposure Date
- Name of the Individual that you suspect the student came in contact with**
- Describe the type of exposure the student may have
- If the student is experiencing any symptoms.

**The Florida Department of Health in Nassau County complies with Florida laws regarding Privacy Rules for health information. This includes disclosing any components of an individual's case investigation.

QUARANTINE TIMELINE FOR PEOPLE WITH NO **SYMPTOMS****

What You Should Do If Your Student Was Exposed At School

- 1. Begin the student's quarantine as soon as you are notified by the school
- 2. Anticipate a call from the Nassau County Health Department to discuss further quarantine requirements.


COVID-19 Vocabulary

Close Contact

Someone who was within 6 ft of an infected person for a total of 14 minutes or more over a 24-hour period starting from 2 days before illness onset until the time the patient is isolated.

Quarantine

Separate or restrict the movement of people who were exposed to a contagious disease to see if they become sick.



After 10-Days, No PCR Test

After 7-Days, With PCR Test

(Must Provide Documentation to FDOH-Nassau Before Released Early)

Date of Last Exposure

Day 6 Earliest Day to Get a PCR Test

Day 14

** Students may not return to any extra-curricular school activities (where social distancing and wearing a mask are not possible) until 14 days after exposure.
