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High School Parents and Families,

As many of you have received notice through your student, campus team or posted information, the Florida Standard Assessments and End of Course exams have begun across the state, some as early as September. Nassau County has decided to begin our assessments in October to ensure students have ample time for review.

We understand assessments can be stressful; if you feel your student is not prepared or unable to take the scheduled assessments during the Fall, they will have the same opportunity later in the school year.

Due to the pandemic, the state provided waivers for the Spring 2020 FSA and EOC exams. This applied to 2020 graduating Seniors. The state continued with Summer 2020 assessments, which Nassau County opted out of, to ensure the continued safety of the community. The state has indicated that 20-21 assessments will take place as scheduled.

Students that need to take the Algebra 1 and Grade 10 ELA Reading for a graduation requirement are being given the opportunity in October and throughout the school year, as in the past.

If your child has taken and passed the Geometry EOC, this will serve as their math graduation requirement.

Students that are striving for a scholar – merit designation are still required to take and pass the Geometry, Biology, and U.S. History Assessment, if they have not already done so.
