COURSE DESCRIPTION

Health Science Anatomy & Physiology begins to lay the framework for a more advanced study of medicine. It provides a basic knowledge of Human Anatomy and Physiology. Because medical terminology is the language of health care providers, insurers, lawyers, medical equipment suppliers, pharmaceutical representatives and consumers, this course provides a strong medical terminology component. **Health Science Anatomy & Physiology** is required for completing the Nursing Assistant 3 Course.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- 1. Identify and discuss the structure and function of the body systems in health and disease.
- 2. Utilize correct medical terminology relating to body function, structure, disease, disorder, as well as, surgical terms, diagnostic terms and complimentary terms.
- 3. Discuss and describe overview of human body, including organization and chemical process.
- 4. Identify cells and tissues microscopically and macroscopically and relate their specialized function.
- 5. Identify and explain factors relating to the transmission of disease.
