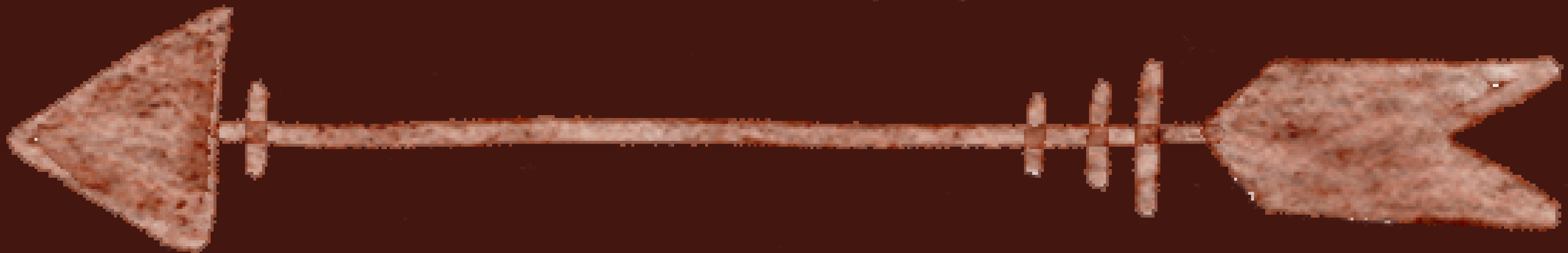

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

- Advanced placement (AP) courses offer students the opportunity to take more rigorous courses and potentially earn college credits.
- Students must pass the AP exam at the end of the course to earn college credits
- Some AP courses we offer include AP Human Geography, AP World History, AP US History, AP Macroeconomics, AP US Government, AP English Language & Composition, and AP Psychology



DUAL ENROLLMENT PATHWAYS

EARLY COLLEGE

- Available starting in 9th grade; students apply in 8th grade
- Students work on earning their high school diploma and Associates of Arts Degree simultaneously
- Students will take DE courses through FSCJ at the high school and FSCJ campus
- Limited to 60 credit hours towards the AA Degree
- 11th and 12th grade years are 100% off campus at FSCJ's Nassau Center (transportation is available from WNHS to the Nassau Center located in Yulee)

TRADITIONAL

- Available to 10th-12th grade students who have earned required HS credits, 3.0 Unweighted GPA, and qualifying test scores
- 10th grade students are limited to taking SLS1103 only
- 11th-12th grade students may take maximum 3 courses per semester
 - Max of 2 courses taken on FSCJ Campus
- Potential to earn 36+ college credit hours while in high school

EARLY ADMISSION

- Available to 12th grade students only
- Senior year is 100% off campus at FSCJ
- Current requirements:
 - Cumulative Unweighted GPA of 3.5 or higher
 - College Ready Test Scores
 - Graduation test requirements met
- Apply with your School Counselor by end of April of 11th grade year

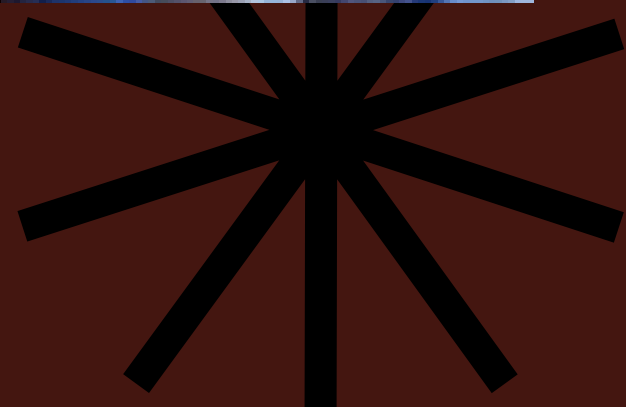

EARLY GRADUATION (MID-YEAR GRADUATES)



- If students are ahead on their graduation requirements, they can apply for early graduation with their School Counselor.
- Students must maintain a high unweighted GPA and apply for early graduation by May 1st.
- Applications are then reviewed by the principal during the summer of junior year.
- Seniors who receive notification that they been approved for early graduation will graduate after the first semester.



SAT & ACT

- WNHS students will have the opportunity to take a free SAT test during their junior year of high school
- Students do not have to register or pay a fee to take these tests

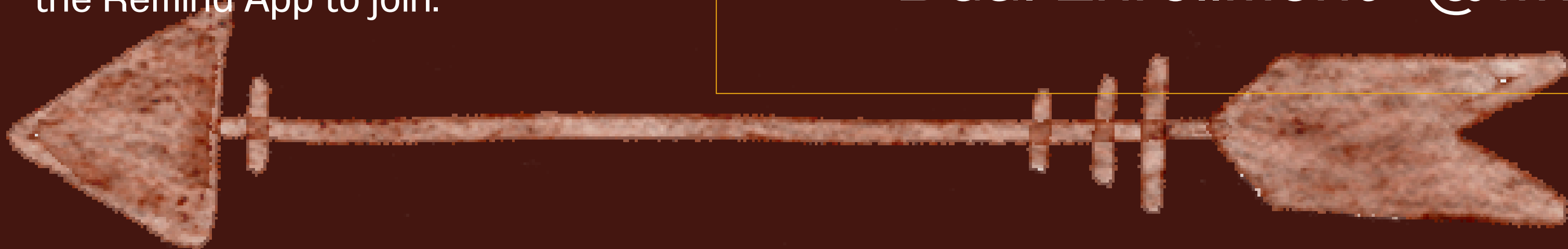

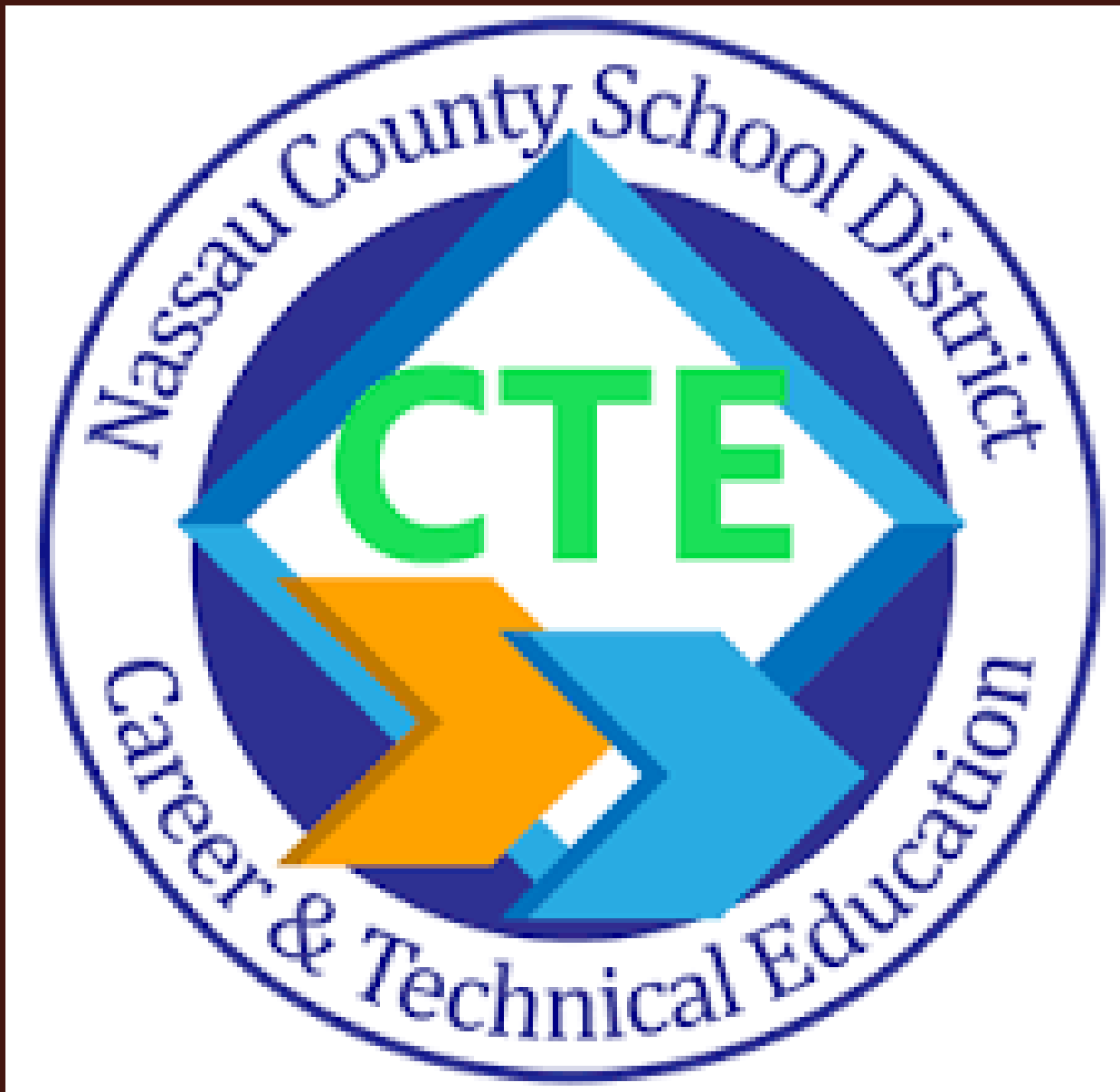
