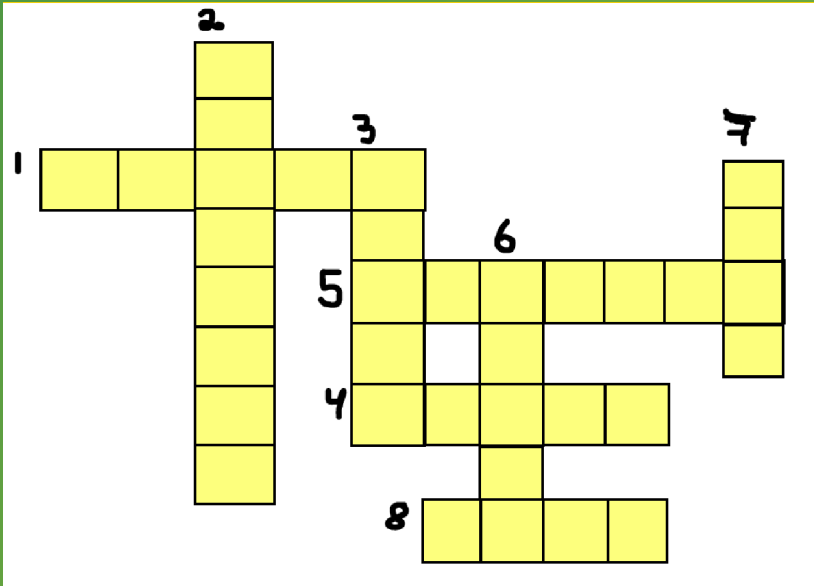

An Interview with Dr. Middleton

Q: "Is it easy to work with the people around you?"

A: Definitely! Especially because when you are an assistant principal you hire a lot of the teachers, and you hire the people and support staff that are around you. So, that kind of creates a bond between you and those people. I think it's really cool to hire somebody and watch them grow from first year teacher or first year at Yulee Middle School teacher who has experience somewhere, it's really cool to watch them grow from that. I think that our staff works the hardest, out of every staff team that I have worked with. We are very communicative and committed. Everybody just makes it easy to like one another. And I wouldn't call it friends, but I would say that we have a climate where everybody is respectful of one another, and I really do appreciate that."

Q: "Do you have fun doing your job?"

A: Yes, I definitely do! You know how some people say that they don't want to get up and go to work? They're like 'Oh I hate going to work!' I don't ever feel that way. Sometimes I am in the car driving home from work, and I just wonder what it feels like to hate your job, because for me that's not how it is at all. Of course, there are some days that are hard, there are some days where you wish you didn't have a bad conversation with someone, or you have to discipline someone, which I don't like. But I have never had a time where I feel like I just never want to come back. I don't hate this job at all, I really have fun and I love it."

Q: "How does having this job play into your family?"

A: "It is about finding that work-life balance really. I don't have children, but I do have a husband who is an Air Traffic Controller, and we just kind of have to figure things out together. For example, he works late on Mondays and Tuesdays, so I stay here very late on Mondays and Tuesdays to get everything done for the week so I can be out in classrooms. There are a lot of emails that need to be sent and paperwork that needs to be done, but while the students are here, I try to be out of this office and in the classrooms as much as possible."

Interview with Mrs. Amos

Q: "What is your favorite part of the job, what is your least favorite?"

A: "I absolutely love getting to build relationships with teachers and students. On the other hand, my least favorite part is punishing people."

Q: "Is it easy to work with the people around you?"

A: "It's a really awesome school; I work closest with Dr. Smith and Dr. Middleton. Everyone here is really easy to work with. As for the children I work with, so many of the children's parents were taught by me when they were at Yulee and Fernandina high school. The community here is like having my own neighbors work with me."

Q: "Do you have fun doing your job?"

A: "Yes, I get to be silly and goofy, and people appreciate it; when I was teaching high school, the twelfth graders look at me like I was crazy. I have lots of fun every day!"

Q: "How does this job play into your family?"

A: "I wanted to be a teacher because I wanted to start a family and have holidays off to spend with my loved ones. I got to teach at the same school that my girls were going to, so I got to have a year here with them in eighth grade."

Q: "Do you have any goals for your future?"

A: "I want to see Yulee Middle School become an 'A' rated school, and one day I would like to work into the position of being principal."

Q: "What did you do before you were in education and what have you done since being in education?"

A: "I have never been in any field other than education and now I have a national board certification, I love helping students in need."

Q: "What was your favorite school subject?"

A: "Hands down, my favorite is English. I was always the kid who finished her work early and got in trouble for reading in class."

The movie is about a family made up of the parents, Paul and Zoey Baker, and nine kids, Luna, Luca, Harley, Ella, Haresh, Bronx, Bailey, Deja, and DJ; they take custody of the cousin, Seth, further into the movie. The family owns a restaurant that serves breakfast - only breakfast - the restaurant is well known for its special sauce, of which its flavors are all in one. The family then begins a journey full of the twists and turns of drama, the rich life, and the day-to-day struggles the world may throw at you.

Personally, I think that the movie is of good quality, although it's "cringey" and seems more like an "inspirational movie," similar to ones found on YouTube, rather than an all-out, full-blown Disney movie. 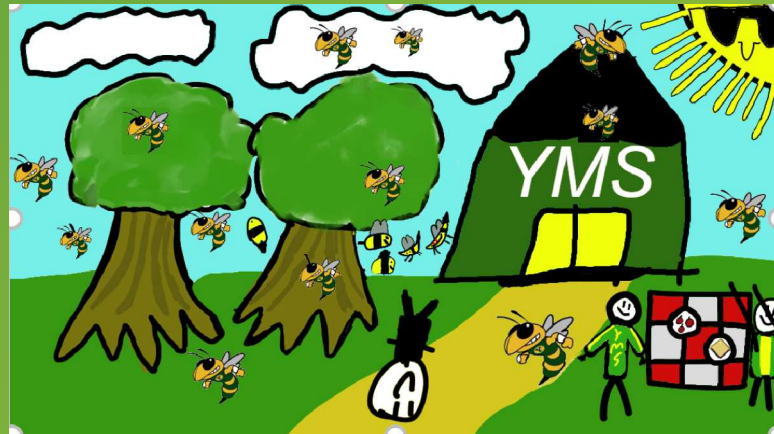

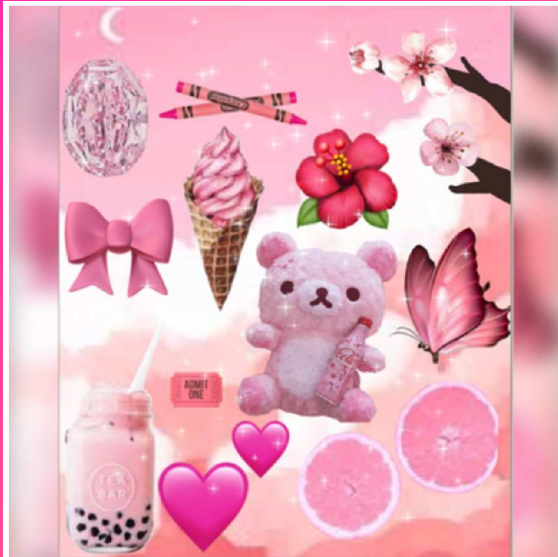
